

- June 2004: "BHS Alumnus is Rhodes Scholar" Allyssa Lamb, Class of 1999, is first BHS Alumnus to be selected for the age-old honor.
- December 2004: "Twenty Year Gold Medal Anniversary" for Tracie Ruiz-Conforto, BHS Class of 1981 Tracie garnered the gold at the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles in synchronized swimming.
- December 2008: "Bothell Grad's Inspiring Career History" Bob (James Robert) Milam, BHS Class of 1940 Author, Lecturer, 1983 Co-Founder of Lakeside-Milam Treatment Center.
- December 2010: "National Honor Leads BHS Alumnus to a Distinguished Career" Gary Wegner, BHS 1963, was a finalist in the 1963 Westinghouse Science Talent Search and went on to become Professor of Physics & Astronomy at Dartmouth College.
- June 2014: "Following a Mission of Music" Nancy Haining Strand, 1966, and the story of her singing career, which started at BHS.
- December 2016: "Bothell Fire Unites Community" Report on the circumstances of the July 22, 2016 Main Street fire in Bothell and how community came together in a crisis.


This could be the second to the last issue of Cougar Tracks newsletter and this coming summer may be the last All Alumni Picnic if alumni do not volunteer for the board and/or other committees in the Association. ALL of the present officers and board and some committee members have decided to retire, many after 25 years of dedication. Most of these volunteer positions take a maximum of two to three hours a month, including the 1-2 hour meetings. So if you are thinking you don't have time please reconsider. Is it a commitment? Yes, but one that brings so much to so many.

By the time of incorporation in 1994 the Association boasted 210 alumni members. The entire membership list was published in the December 2009 issue of Cougar Tracks. In the last 25 years the Association has awarded 26 scholarships (two in 1996 and added a vocational scholarship in 2018); has sponsored 22 All Alumni Picnics; has produced 48 newsletters including this one; served 1,094 members; participated in 20 homecomings (12 years in a row honoring an alumnus); helped classes with their database for reunions by maintaining a database of over 25,000 alumni, and produced four All-Alumni directories (in 1995, 2000, 2005, and 2015).

This will all come to an end in November 2019 unless more volunteers come forward. Again, please step up now so the existing board can aid in the transition of information. People think someone else is coming forward but they are not. Our new 1971 alumnus, Duane Love, featured below, needs associates. Remember the time commitment for most of the board or committees is maybe two to three hours a month!

Duane Love Joins the BHSAA Board

Responding to the call for new directors, Duane Love, class of 1971, wants to demonstrate his Cougar pride by volunteering to serve on the Alumni Association Board for a two year term beginning in January 2019. He was elected to the board at the general meeting held on November 10. Duane was raised that when you see a need in your community, you help out however you can, and he doesn't want to see the Association come to an end. Duane also volunteers on the board of directors for his homeowner's association, and has served as their board president for the past two years, so he has valuable experience with managing non-profits and with parliamentary procedure.



After graduating from Bothell High in June 1971, Duane decided to follow in his father's footsteps by becoming an auctioneer and graduated from the Reisch American School of Auctioneering in Mason City, Iowa (now known as the World Wide School of Auctioneering) in December 1971. He has owned and operated Evergreen Auction Service since March of 1979. Duane has moved around the state since graduating, living in Bellingham, Kirkland and Edmonds, but returned to Bothell in 1988. He has three daughters and his youngest graduated from Bothell High School in 2002, continuing the Cougar tradition. Welcome Duane, and thanks for volunteering!

Bothell High School Senior Nolan Hendrickson Named NSD Wall of Honor Recipient for Community Service/Humanitarian Scholarship

The Northshore School District Wall of Honor Program is proud to announce that Nolan Hendrickson, a Bothell High School senior, is this year's Wall of Honor Community Service/Humanitarian Scholarship recipient. This is the NSD Wall of Honor's fifth annual presentation of this scholarship. It recognizes students who have demonstrated a passion for making communities a better place to live.

Most notable were the actions Nolan took over the years to insure classmates be included in what should be the hallmark of many students' high school experiences: school dances and class events. He was very active in fundraising activities. Believing strongly in inclusivity and diversity, Nolan wanted regular school functions to be available to everyone at little or no cost. Fund-raisers included movie marathons, volleyball, and basketball tournaments. He worked with local test-prep organizations for ACT and SAT practice tests so they could be offered at the high school, with ASB sharing in the proceeds. He worked with the ASB executive team to raise over ten thousand dollars for his junior class. Nolan said, "I am passionate about inclusivity and diversity and plan to continue these pursuits in college and throughout my life."

Nolan's leadership roles started as a freshman, taking on the responsibilities as class vice-president, then sophomore class executive team representative, junior class vice-president and senior class president. He was also treasurer for the National Honor Society.

Volunteer work included working at the Pacific Medical Centers in Bothell and at the 21 Acres Organization in Woodinville. His honors and awards included National Merit Scholar Commendation, Hispanic National Merit Scholar, WIAA Academic Award—[4.0] grades 9-12, BHS Honor Guard, and BHS 2017 Homecoming King. If you think all these activities demonstrate a vast array of involvement, consider that he was also active in football, track, math club, key club and link leader, as well.

Nolan has an interest in the medical field as well as computer science. He plans to pursue dual degrees in computational neuroscience and computer science at the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia. Future plans include attending graduate school to obtain an MD/PhD and working in healthcare. His ultimate desire is to work with industry and research new technological advances to treat significant neurologic diseases, such as dementia/Alzheimer's, Parkinson's Disease, and other developmental neurologic disorders.



The Wall of Honor, displayed at Pop Keeney Field, honors graduates and faculty who have established a legacy while making our local and global communities a better place to live. The Wall of Honor's Humanitarian/Community Service Scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate similar traits, and encourage continued involvement in their community as they further their education and start their careers.

The scholarship recipients will be honored at the NSD Scholarship Foundation breakfast on May 22. This year's Wall of Honor ceremony will be inducting alumni and faculty members of the Northshore School District at the Pop Keeney Field, Thursday, August 16, beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Northshore Teacher's Murder Still Unsolved

In April of 2013, Earl Cossey, a retired science teacher and popular coach at Leota Junior High was murdered in the garage of his Woodinville home, a victim of blunt force trauma to the head. His murder has yet to be solved. As part of the investigation, the police talked to the FBI about Cossey's links to the D.B. Cooper skyjacking. Cossey was a parachute rigger and skydiving instructor who had provided some military-issue parachutes to the skydive club at Issaquah. In 1971, when a Northwest Orient passenger calling himself Dan Cooper demanded that he be given \$200,000 and four parachutes or he would blow up the plane, a call went out to the skydive club and they provided two of the four parachutes--chutes that were packed by Cossey. Because of that, for many years, Cossey was visited by the FBI whenever they found remnants of a parachute within the range of the Cooper jump zone. In 2016, the FBI officially closed the unsolved D.B. Cooper case after 45 years of investigation, but there are still many amateur sleuths, writers, and historians trying to uncover the skyjacker's true identity. There is even an annual convention in Portland.

While there continues to be public interest in the D.B Cooper case, the leads in the Cossey case have gone cold. Just days after his murder someone mailed pieces of Cossey's ID back to his house. There was no return address on the envelope, and the police surmised that a good Samaritan had probably found the ID and decided to mail it back. The Sheriff's department put out a plea for information about the ID, and a reward was posted, but no one ever came forward. While the police would not discuss a motive, they did say the house had been ransacked, and some sources said there had been reports of burglaries in the neighborhood. According to an article in the Woodinville Weekly, Cossey's family said he was a kind and generous man, who just the week before his death had stopped to lend a hand to a stranded motorist. Students who attended Leota Jr. High remember how he skydived onto the field on Lion's Day, and how he always seemed happy to see them. Our hearts go out to his family, friends, and the many students who benefited from his 25 years of teaching and coaching. "A teacher is a compass that activates the magnets of curiosity, knowledge, and wisdom in the pupils." Ever Garrison

Since 1998 the BHS Alumni Association has sponsored scholarships for graduating seniors from BHS. The Scholarship Foundation of Northshore has worked as the administrator of the funds each year. For academic year 2017-2018, the Scholarship Foundation awarded it's three millionth scholarship dollar.

The Foundation and their supporting organizations, like the BHS Alumni Association, provided 81 scholarships last year totaling \$230,000. Generous donations from the community have made it possible for the Foundation to award 2,000 scholarships over the last 33 years; the average grant in 2018 was nearly \$3,000 per recipient.

I am proud of our Bothell High Alumni Association for sponsoring two scholarships this year, each worth \$2,500. One scholarship is for an individual seeking secondary education at a vocational/technical school; the other is for a general studies focus at a two or four year College or University.






